We Want to Hear from YOU!



The New York State Department of Health AIDS Institute, the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and the Nassau County Department of Health are working on the jointly submitted 2022-2026 Integrated HIV Prevention and Care Plan (Integrated Plan) to The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). The Integrated Plan will align with New York State Ending the Epidemic efforts, as well as the HIV National Strategic Plan and the Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S. (EHE) initiative. Critical to the success of the Integrated Plan is engagement with a wide range of stakeholders.

As part of this effort, we are seeking community input on emerging trends in HIV prevention and treatment that will inform the Integrated Plan.

[The National Society of Black Women in Medicine](#), formerly known as Black Women in Medicine Inc., was founded on the campus of Florida State University on October 14th 2017 by Amber Balkcom and Ashlei Phillips. The two students had the idea on a walk back to the campus library. They both agreed that there was a need for more representation of minority women in medicine and scientific disciplines. That night in lieu of studying Amber typed up the mission statement of Black Women in Medicine with Ashlei by her side designing the infamous logo. They were prepared to take on a new challenge that later transformed into a movement.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Funeral Assistance

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

FEMA is providing financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.



To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or qualified alien.
- The deceased person's death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to or caused by COVID-19. If a death occurred between Jan. 20 and May 16, 2020, and the death certificate doesn't attribute the death to COVID-19, include a signed statement from the death certificate's certifying official, local coroner or medical examiner that links the cause of death to COVID-19.

Which expenses will qualify for reimbursement?

Examples of eligible expenses may include, but not limited to:

- Transportation to identify the deceased individual
- The transfer of remains
- A burial plot or cremation niche
- A marker or headstone
- Clergy or officiant services
- The use of funeral home equipment or staff
- Cremation or interment costs

What information do I need to provide to FEMA?

Please have the following information before contacting FEMA to apply:

- Name, social security number, date of birth, mailing address and contact phone numbers.
- Name, social security number and date of birth for each deceased individual.
- Location or address where the deceased individual passed away.
- Documentation and receipts for any assistance already received from other sources, including burial or funeral insurance, donations, voluntary agencies, other government programs or non-profit organizations.
- The name and information of any co-applicant(s) if anyone besides yourself incurred funeral expenses for the deceased individual(s).

HOW DO I APPLY FOR THIS ASSISTANCE?

Call FEMA's COVID-19 Funeral Assistance Helpline at 1-844-684-6333 (TTY: 800-462-7585) from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. ET, Monday – Friday and begin the application process.

What Does the New York State Budget Mean For You?

The 2023 New York State budget has made major funding commitments to support families, communities, and healthcare workers and institutions. Here are some key provisions and what they mean for New Yorkers.

ISSUE	WHAT IS IN THE BUDGET?	WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?	HOW DO YOU ACCESS IT?
Safety Net Hospitals	Funding for financially distressed and safety net hospitals	Safety net hospitals are a lifeline throughout the state especially for low-income New Yorkers. Funding shortages have caused many to shut down. The budget helps financially struggling hospitals to stay open and serve their communities.	Safety net hospitals will receive this additional funding through the state's Distressed Provider Assistance Account.
Mental Health	Grants to school districts for mental health services; funding for the suicide prevention & mental health hotline system; funding for hospital mental health services	The COVID pandemic has exposed the serious need for more mental health services in our communities as well as the inequality in access to these services. The budget provides funding to address these gaps.	If your family or community is seeking mental health services call your healthcare provider or school district to inquire about accessing these services.
Homecare Workers	\$3 hourly raise	Homecare workers have waited a long time to receive fair wages for the vital work they do. If the state Medicaid program pays homecare workers a better wage, this means families can hire quality care for their seniors and others who need homecare.	Homecare workers will receive this pay increase through their employers. It will be disbursed in installments starting October.
Frontline Healthcare Workers	Bonuses for our overworked healthcare workers who risked everything while working throughout the pandemic	Our frontline healthcare workers worked without a pause, risking their lives during the last two years of the COVID pandemic. The bonus recognizes their lifesaving work and very long hours.	The bonus will be paid to healthcare workers by the state through their employers.
Medicaid Eligibility Expanded	Expanded for all low-income New Yorkers with disabilities, and age 65 and up	One in three New Yorkers rely on Medicaid. The budget expands the eligibility of Medicaid so that no New Yorker who needs healthcare should go without it.	Contact New York State of Health to check eligibility. Childcare	Funding for childcare	Always a critical need for families, childcare became even more urgent during the pandemic. Eligibility for childcare is set at 300% of the federal poverty level – or a family of three making \$70,000 or less per year. We are excited to announce that applications for the second annual Heumann-Armstrong Awards are now open! We will be awarding \$1000 prizes to six students, in the 6th grade or higher, who demonstrate their commitment to fighting against ableism in education. Students in middle school, high school and higher education (community college, college, university, and graduate and professional degree programs) are eligible for this award. Awardees will be interviewed about their educational experiences and their interviews will be published on The Coelho Center and Equal Opportunities for Students webpages and other social media platforms.

We have sought to make the application process as accessible as possible. Students can apply [via our online form](#) or they can submit a video answering our application questions. We require no letters of recommendation, no resume, and no GPA for the award. There is no age requirement for the award, as we understand not all students follow the implicit timeline of our school system. Our only requirements are that the applicant (1) is a current student with a disability who (2) is willing to do a video interview upon winning the award.



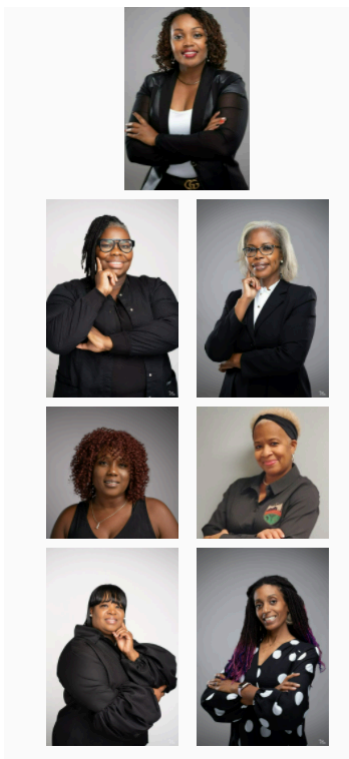
